

Boating

Speed Limit (including Jet Skis)

It is important that everyone understands their roles and responsibilities when it comes to boating regulations. A 4 knot limit applies:

- Within the mooring line of the beach
- Within 50m of any mooring, vessel, buoy, boat ramp or person(s) in the water including divers.

Life Jackets

Anyone aboard a vessel less than 4.8m in length must wear a life jacket at all times. Children aged 12 and under must wear a life jacket on any vessel at all times. Visit marinesafety.sa.gov.au.

Jet Skis

All jet skis must be registered for use in South Australia and the operator must be licensed.

Operating Hours:

- Monday to Saturday: 8am to 8pm (or sunset)
- Sunday: 9am to 8pm (or sunset)

Cleaning Fish

Cleaning fish and/or disposing of fish offal (including crab shells) on the beach is prohibited by Council.

Boat Ramp

The boat ramp is located at the western end of Black Point. It is recommended that the ramp only be used when there is > 1m tide. Fees apply to use the boat ramp.

- There is a ticket machine at the boat ramp. Coins
- Permits available online www.yorke.sa.gov.au.
- Tickets and permits must be clearly displayed. Fines include a maximum penalty of \$750 and \$100 for expiation notice.
- Vehicles (including buggies and motorbikes) are prohibited on the beach unless a permit is obtained from Council.

Safety

Animals and Sea Life

- Watch out for Blue Ring Octopus: do not turn over
- Wear shoes when walking out to the reef and within the seaweed to protect your feet from razor fish and any other hazards that may be present in the water.
- Keep an eye out for snakes.

Medical Emergencies

Defibrillators are located at:

- Shack 32: beach side
- Shack 42: road side
- 157 Harvey Crescent: road side

Instructions are provided. For all emergencies call ooo.

Fire

In the event of a fire, a water trailer is available for use. It is located south of Shack 132.

Fireworks

SA legislation has strict controls over use of fireworks. Please check the local Council and CFS websites for information before use.

Campfires

Campfires are NOT to be lit during the Fire Danger season (1 November - 30 April).

At other times campfires are permitted under the following conditions:

- Fire is contained within a fireplace, portable cooking
- Fire pits must be 30cm deep and no larger than 1m², with a 4m cleared space around and above the fire.
- A responsible person must be present at all times.
- Adequate extinguishing agent must be at hand.
- Fire must be completely extinguished before leaving

The Council strongly recommends that dogs be on a leash

and under effective control in all public areas including on the beach and in Maxine Hawke Park. Owners must remove dog defecation from all public areas. Bags are available on the public walkways.

Noise and Respect

Shacks are in close proximity to each other. Please respect your neighbours and their privacy. Be aware of noise, shared parking and above all respect each other's space.

Bins

Dogs

It is a good idea to place bins out the night before collection days:

- **RED** for general waste: weekly on Mondays (including public holidays)
- YELLOW for recycling: fortnightly on Mondays
- **GREEN** for organics: see timetable at www.yorke.sa.gov.au
- **BLUE** bins for empty refundable cans and bottles (only) on public walkways: funds raised go to BPPA.

Please do not place stones on top of bins. The collection date calendar is available on the Black Point website: www.blackpointsa.com.au.

Local Refuse Transfer Station (Dump)

Three sites: Warooka, CYP (Arthurton) and Ramsay (Port Vincent). Open on a user pays basis. Closed Public Holidays. Further information: Yorke Peninsula Council (08) 8832 0000 or <u>www.yorke.sa.gov.au</u>.

Pedestrian Beach Access

Please do not walk through private property. Those staying in properties on the southern side of Black Point Drive must use the walkways situated next to Shacks 18, 71, 90, 120, 143 and 149 to access the beach. The beach can also be accessed via the boat ramp, the Point and caravan park steps.

Native Vegetation

It is an offence to remove native vegetation without a Council permit, including the collection of firewood.
